Commercial Fishing Crew Duties



Keep the boat clean


Set and haul the gear

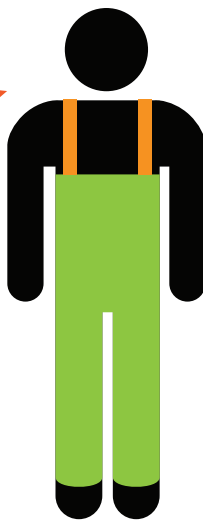

Handle the catch


Prepare the bait and gear



Follow captain's orders



Stay aware of surroundings

Good with your 'sea legs'?

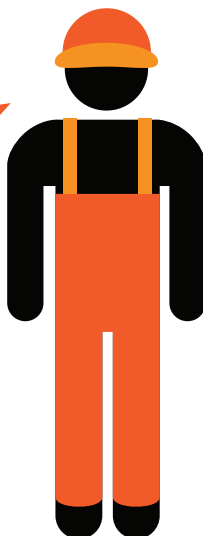

Able to work as a team?

Look for a captain that is...

1 A good communicator
Teaches crew how to be successful. Upfront with their expectations

2 Serious about safety
Conducts monthly drills, has all safety equipment, and puts safety before profit

3 Level-headed
Keeps calm in difficult situations


4 Experienced
Knows how to operate the vessel and is good at fishing


5 Responsible
Maintains boat, gear, and equipment. Cares about the crew




Ask the captain what he expects of the crewmen

? What are your duties?


What will your pay be? What is your cost share?


Who will pay for your food?


How many trips are expected? How long will they be?


"You need open communication about crew duties rather than just expecting crew to know."

"You might not get rich, but it's a good job!"
